Jimmy Scholin - Jimmy was a beacon of laughter. He was a joy to be around, funny, even a little mischievous now and then. He never had a harsh word for anyone, loved going on Mission Trips and being in the high school group. He was always eager to learn new things, work hard and most of all, have fun while doing it.

Todd Weems – Todd was a tall and lanky kid who was always whistling and drumming his fingers to the latest music. He was always talking, full of new ideas and questions. A people lover, Todd never met a person he wouldn't want to call "friend." He not only told stories and wrote poems, he wanted to hear others' stories again and again.
